GFILS receive preference for travel funding to Legal Studies conferences (Law and Society Association; Conference on Empirical Legal Studies; Law, Culture and Humanities) if they are on the program and presenting a paper. GFILS will also be notified about Graduate Assistantships for undergraduate Legal Studies courses as well as calls for papers.
