### Requirements for the Minor in Legal Studies

(8 courses total)

- There must be at least one course to satisfy each of the five categories: argument and communication; global and comparative studies; institutions, organizations, economics; law and inequality; theory and philosophy.
- Students who entered Northwestern in the Fall 2014 or later are required to take LEGAL ST/SOCIOL 206 to complete the minor.
- NO electives may be double counted. There is no limit on the number of "Related Courses" that may double-count.
- At most 2 Chicago Field Studies credits may be counted. (At least one of these credits can automatically count towards Area C "Institutions/Orgs/Econ." CFS 391, CFS 394, CFS 396, CFS 397 may count for two credits, all others count for one credit.)
- All courses must have a minimum grade of C-.
